## ON EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN Matthew 4:18-22

What comes to mind when you hear the word Christian?

18 One day as Jesus was walking along the shore of the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers—Simon, also called Peter, and Andrew—throwing a net into the water, for they fished for a living. 19 Jesus called out to them, "Come, follow me, and I will show you how to fish for people!" 20 And they left their nets at once and followed him. 21 A little farther up the shore he saw two other brothers, James and John, sitting in a boat with their father, Zebedee, repairing their nets. And he called them to come, too. 22 They immediately followed him, leaving the boat and their father behind. (Matthew 4:18-22, NLT).

I. JESUS DOESN'T CHOOSE THE BEST, HE CHOOSES THE  Stop making excuses that you are not able. He doesn't need your ability; He requires only your availability. Have you made yourself available?
II, NOT WE HIM.
"You didn't choose me. I chose you. I appointed you to go and produce lasting fruit, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask for, using my name." (John 15:16, NLT)
III. OUR PRIMARY CALLING IS TO
Get His Word inside of you until it dominates all your thinking and all your behavior. Until you think it and talk it and quote it.
IV. TO FOLLOW HIM, WE HAVE TO
Boat: Our careers (the way we take care of ourselves).
Father: Our most significant relationships.
To follow Jesus, He has to take precedence over both.
V. HE COMMANDS US TO
This is an essential part of being a disciple. It's not something that only a few of us do; it's something that each of us does. There is no such thing

"When you produce much fruit, you are my true disciples. This brings great glory to my Father." (John 15:8, NLT)

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20, ESV)

"The Son of Man came to seek and save the lost." (Luke 19:10)
