



### Discuss.

1. Discuss the idea that our generation is the first to experience all the signs of the end times at the same time. Because of technology and other circumstances, we can now fulfill signs that could not be fulfilled up to this point. Discuss.

2. Pastor shared about the 70 "sevens" Daniel prophesied, 69 of them have been fulfilled. In the first 7 the temple was rebuilt, then at the end of the next 62 sevens, Jesus gave His life. These fulfillments give validity to Daniel's prophecy and also to the Bible itself. Discuss the power of the Living Word to bring peace and revelation to our lives.

3. "The goal of Bible study is not to have more knowledge; the goal is to know Jesus more and know how to apply what you read to how to live your life." Discuss why the pursuit of knowledge, just for knowledge's sake, isn't advantageous for those of us who know Jesus.

4. Read 2 Peter 3:10-12. What does Peter tell us that we should do? How should we live our lives knowing that Jesus will return someday?

5. If you knew Jesus was coming in 90 days how would it change your life? Would you live differently?

### Work:

- Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal anything to you that you need to address in your life.
- Pray for one another.
