# Message

FROM THE LEAD PASTOR

*And Joshua set up twelve stones in the midst of the Jordan,  
in the place where the feet of the priests bearing the ark of the covenant had stood;*

JOSHUA 4:9

As soon as the children of Israel crossed the river Jordan, The LORD commanded Joshua to assign twelve men from each tribe of Israel to take twelve stones from the midst of the river. The LORD commanded Joshua to set the stones up as a monument of God's awesome miracle of holding back the waters of the river Jordan, so the Israelites could cross into the Promised Land.

Twelve is a significant number in the Bible. It signifies completeness, divine order, or God's people (as in the 12 tribes of Israel, the 12 apostles) and even in Revelation, where the New Jerusalem has 12 gates and 12 foundations.

This year, Mosaic enters our twelfth year of community and ministry. Like the nation of Israel, we have tasted and seen the goodness of God these last twelve years as a ministry and community, and we are confident that we will do so in the years to come.

This year, we celebrate God's faithfulness by likening each year to a memorial stone in Joshua's time. However, it will be remiss of me if I don't mention how the Apostle Peter uses the analogy of stones to describe the people of God as living stones being built together into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices that are acceptable to God through Jesus Christ (1 Peter 2:5).

With both the Old Testament and New Testament analogies, I want to encourage everyone who calls this community their spiritual home to recall how the LORD brought you here, and what year that was. Think about it:

- How did you discover Mosaic? Did someone invite you?
- Did you find us online or on social media?
- Did you come to know Christ at Mosaic?
- Were you baptized at Mosaic?
- What year did you start attending?
- What made you stay and get plugged in?
- How has God use Mosaic Church to grow you?
- What do you love most about our church?

Like Joshua and the tribal leaders of Israel who set up 12 memorial stones of God's faithfulness, I pray that you will join with us in remembering God's faithfulness to us as He builds us up in faith and community. Remember His amazing grace and faithfulness in every life changed by Christ through the gospel, in every person brought into His family, in every gospel ministry opportunity we are given, every powerful spiritual breakthrough, and the very presence of His Holy Spirit which we experience in our worship and ministry.

We celebrate the love of God, the grace of our Lord Jesus and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit.

# Gospel



*Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain. # Introducing ALPHA!

## What is The Alpha Course?

The Alpha Course is an 11-week, interactive series designed to explore the basics of the Christian faith in a friendly, open, and informal environment. It is geared toward anyone curious about life, faith, and God, often featuring food, a video/talk, and small group discussion. It's a great place to invite and introduce not-yet Christians to the faith.

Alpha originated in 1977 at Holy Trinity Brompton (HTB) in London and has since been adapted to present Christianity in a highly accessible and conversational way. Over the years, millions have become followers of Jesus through Alpha.

## Key Components of an Alpha Session.

**Food & Connection:** Sessions often begin with a meal or refreshments to help people connect and relax.

**Talks:** A video or live talk explores big questions of life and faith, covering topics like "Who is Jesus?", "Why and how do I pray?", and "How does God guide us?".

**Discussion:** Participants meet in small groups to discuss the talk, share their thoughts, and ask questions in a non-judgmental atmosphere.

**Gospel.** The Gospel is always presented, and people can receive Jesus as Lord and Savior anytime throughout the course.

## Key Aspects of the Alpha Course.

**Open to Everyone:** It is specifically designed for people with different backgrounds, including those who are skeptical or not churchgoers.

**No Pressure:** Participants are free to share or just listen, without pressure to agree with any particular viewpoint.

**Global Reach:** Millions of people have taken Alpha in over 100 countries and in many different languages.

**Universal Format:** It is used by various churches and denominations.

## What happens after the Alpha Course?

On the 11th week, every participant gets invited for an Alpha Weekend encounter with the Holy Spirit. It is often a time when people are given the opportunity to follow Jesus in water baptism. After that, they can join a regular community DGroup.

# Ministry Highlight



## Young Adult Community

To our Mosaic Church,

When I reflect on what 2025 was for us, I am reminded of the 'word' my wife, Shanti and I chose for our year. It came from our Australian church community, based on Joshua 1:6 (MSG) "God, your God, is with you every step you take." It was an encouragement to: Take Another Step of Faith.

We had to put that 'word' into practice very quickly, because 2025 would bring the biggest changes of our lives so far! All in 1 month: we said goodbye to the friends we'd made, moved across the world, and settled back into Lloydminster – all while being newlyweds!

We looked for jobs online for a month, tried acclimatizing to our not-so-spring April weather, and began getting used to the slower pace of life in our small city.

When we walked in Mosaic for the first time in years, you all received us with the biggest smiles and warmest hugs. Our steps of faith following God led us to a safe and green pasture, here in Mosaic Church.

We enjoyed the lives we'd built in Australia, but there came a time when we asked ourselves: "What purpose does God want for our lives?" And although other circumstances factored into our moving – we chose to trust God, that a life full of His purpose for us is greater than our idea of present comfortability.

It was during late Summer, Shanti and I were both feeling the need for community, to connect and make friends with people in our age group, who we could share life and faith with. We ended up hosting a few events and dinners, not thinking too much of it. A few weeks passed when we felt that God was calling us to lead a DGroup for the Young Adults in Mosaic.

Not long after, Pastor Jon asked me for a coffee meeting, where he would extend an offer to be the Assistant Pastor at Mosaic while overseeing our Young Adults community.

Each step of faith got us closer to where God wanted us to be. Even though we didn't know where He was leading us, or our purpose in the moments. The act of 'stepping in faith' transforms the believer from within, and the faithfulness of God produces a blessing.

Let's continue to be a faith-filled people together!

The first 5 months of our YA community have been off to a wonderful start! When God called us to start a DGroup for our 18-to-35(-ish) year olds at Mosaic, we wanted to be obedient to what Jesus was calling us to. So we made space in our lives and in our schedules:

YA DGroup on Thursday Nights at 7PM – we'd prepare a discussion from our Bible Study Guides and everyone brings a small dish to share. We also wanted opportunities for our Young Adults to build friendships with each other, and a space to invite their friends who don't usually come to church! That's when our 'YA Events' got started, and we've strategized to host them once-a-month.

It's genuinely been the Holy Spirit, working in the lives of young people! We're seeing an average of 22 Young Adults active within our community, with 3-in-4 YA's faithfully involved in our Volunteer Teams!

From November 2025-April 2026, we've seen 6 Baptisms from our YA Community. We've had 5 Events together: Friendsgiving, Halloween, Edmonton Road Trip, Christmas Party, Boys Night & Galentine's (with many more to come!)

We are just getting started! And we are so excited to partner with God in His Vision and Heart for the Young Adults of our city and region!

The Vision we have for our Young Adults ministry is a simple and effective one:

*"A faith-filled community, changing young people's lives through the Love of Jesus."*

Our key passage is John 15:12-13 (NLT). During the Last Supper, our Lord Jesus shared these words with His Disciples:  
*"This is my commandment: Love each other in the same way I have loved you. There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends."*

We envision our YA Community being a place where young people can be part of a community that believes, encourages, and champions them. In our community, they will encounter the Gospel by the Power of the Holy Spirit, in the Word and in action. And they will have a space that facilitates meeting friends for their future.

# Compassion



*Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."*



MATTHEW 9:35-38

In the Bible, compassion is more than a feeling; it is a deep, visceral emotion—often likened to a parent's love or genuine lingering empathy—that drives action to alleviate suffering.

It is a central attribute of God. Exodus 34:6, "The Lord, the Lord, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness."

Compassion is characterized by empathy and mercy, that leads to action.

Biblical compassion sees beyond the immediate need. When we look around our city, we see so much need. Christians can sometimes be so engrossed in addressing immediate physical needs but forgetting the deeper spiritual need. If we provide only bread for the body, but neglect to provide bread for the soul, we are not exercising biblical compassion.

# Mission

Then Jesus came to them and said,  
"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.  
Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them  
in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

Derived from the Latin *missio*, meaning a "sending" or "being sent," the mission of every believer and local church is to make the message of Jesus Christ known to all people, especially in unreached areas.

This mission is God's (*Missio Dei*).  
His mission is to renew all things and establish His kingdom through His Son, our Lord Jesus--a new Eden.

He saved us and is calling each of us to join Him in His mission to redeem humanity one life at a time and to renew creation, hence it is called the Great Commission, in the sense that we are on mission with Him. He has given us one message--the Gospel. Involvement in the Mission can be as simple as telling your neighbor about Jesus, inviting them to know Him. It can involve dedicating your whole life to serving God in church leadership, church planting or leaving your home culture into another to share the Gospel.

Whether He calls us to stay or to go, we are on the move for the mission of God, with one Gospel message.

The Mission is to build God's Kingdom.  
The Message is the Gospel of Jesus.  
The Method is the Movement of His followers.

# 2027 Church Plant



## The Battle Plan for the Battlefords

Since the early days of our existence, Pastor Jon has shared the dream of planting new churches to reach more people with the gospel beyond our city.

In April 2018's annual meeting, he shared the big vision of expanding our church's reach and he presented a map that encompassed Lloydminster and surrounding towns and cities: Cold Lake, Vermillion, Wainwright, and North Battleford. It was the Battlefords that caught my attention. Perhaps, it was because I found myself there at different times as a teenager.

It was in the town of Battleford where I bought my first car, a red sporty coupe which had to be towed to Lloydminster due to repairs. It was in North Battleford, near the Gold Eagle Casino where I competed in the Saskatchewan Boxing Provincials and made great memories with friends.

At that time I remember taking a trip to downtown and the mall and we were told by our coaches not to get into fights with the locals. We've never been warned so sternly about other cities but we learned that the city had a reputation for high crime.

In 2018 North Battleford was named "Canada's most dangerous place" by Maclean's annual based on the Crime Severity Index. It is used to measure both volume and severity of crime in Canada from city to city, coast to coast.

In response to the vision Pastor Jon shared and what felt like a nudge from the Lord, I took a trip to the city of Battleford and North Battleford in August 2018 with my little brother Manny to scout and pray over both towns. This trip would be the starting point of many visits with which the only agenda is to pray over the city and to ask the Lord whether this is where he is calling us to plant a church.

Almost 8 years since then, on Monday February 9th, 2026 I was awakened from my sabbath snoozing by what felt like a strong prompting to the Spirit "get up and pray over that place again". Immediately I told my wife Abigail that we need to go to the Battlefords to pray over it; something that we have been doing once a year since 2018 but there was something different about this visit.

Thursday came and we made the 138 kilometer-drive from Lloydminster to the Battlefords. We spent the day there seeking the Lord's direction and scouting the city. We also started making connections and conversations with the local people. In fact, we started to see some doors open for opportunities to build common ground with the locals.

One of those opportunities is getting involved with the local Boxing club. Interestingly, as rare as it is- on that same day, I received an open invitation to be a mentor/coach by the vice president of Boxing Saskatchewan, who happens to run the Boxing club in North Battleford.





I told him if I do get involved with the club I will bring the gospel with me and share the Word with everyone willing to listen. That my goal is first and foremost to reach people far from God and in need of the light of Jesus!

His answer to me was surprisingly in agreement and then told me he is a believer in Christ and that this city indeed needs more gospel ministry. In fact, this Boxing club is made possible through partnership with a local church there and where they're situated is in the upper room of the church.

Finally, when my wife and I got home we immediately debriefed and prayed some more. The answer we have been seeking from the Lord of where to plant a church had finally been answered. And with doors continuing to open up for us now we will strike while the iron is hot.

Our plan is to move our lives there by potentially by fall of this year and start the work of planting a new Mosaic in the Battlefords. Our goal is to start a core team right away and begin small gatherings potentially in November 2026.

Please pray for us that the Lord would continue to do His mighty work and that we would be able to capitalize on all the opportunities he provides. Pray also for each of you and ask the Lord in what ways he would want you to get involved with this new work and to know how you can utilize your gifts and resources to help build the dream God has given us at Mosaic to reach those who need the gospel beyond our city!

*My aim is to preach the gospel where Christ has not been named, so that I will not build on someone else's foundation, but, as it is written, Those who were not told about him will see, and those who have not heard will understand.*

In February of 2026, we launched a fundraising campaign and many of our church family and some friends gave generously.

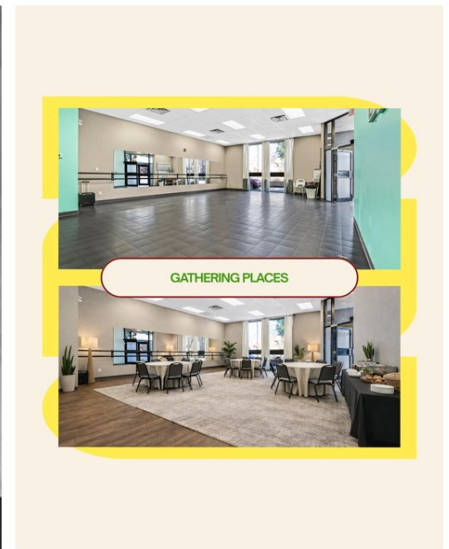
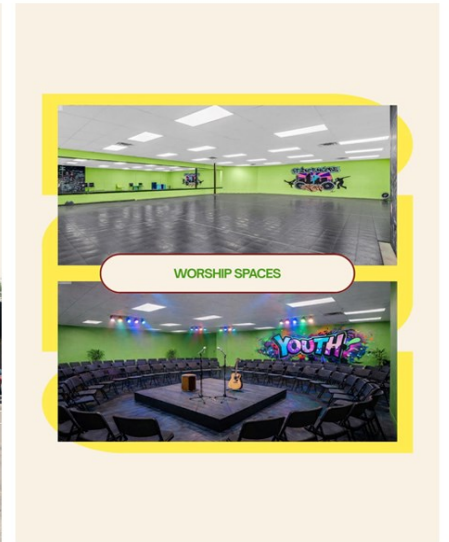
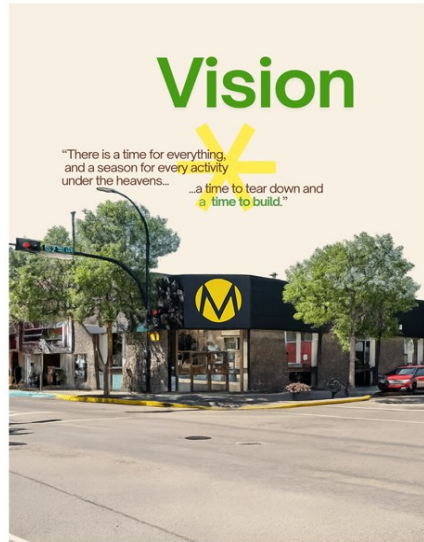

We will keep the church updated on the latest developments on the building!

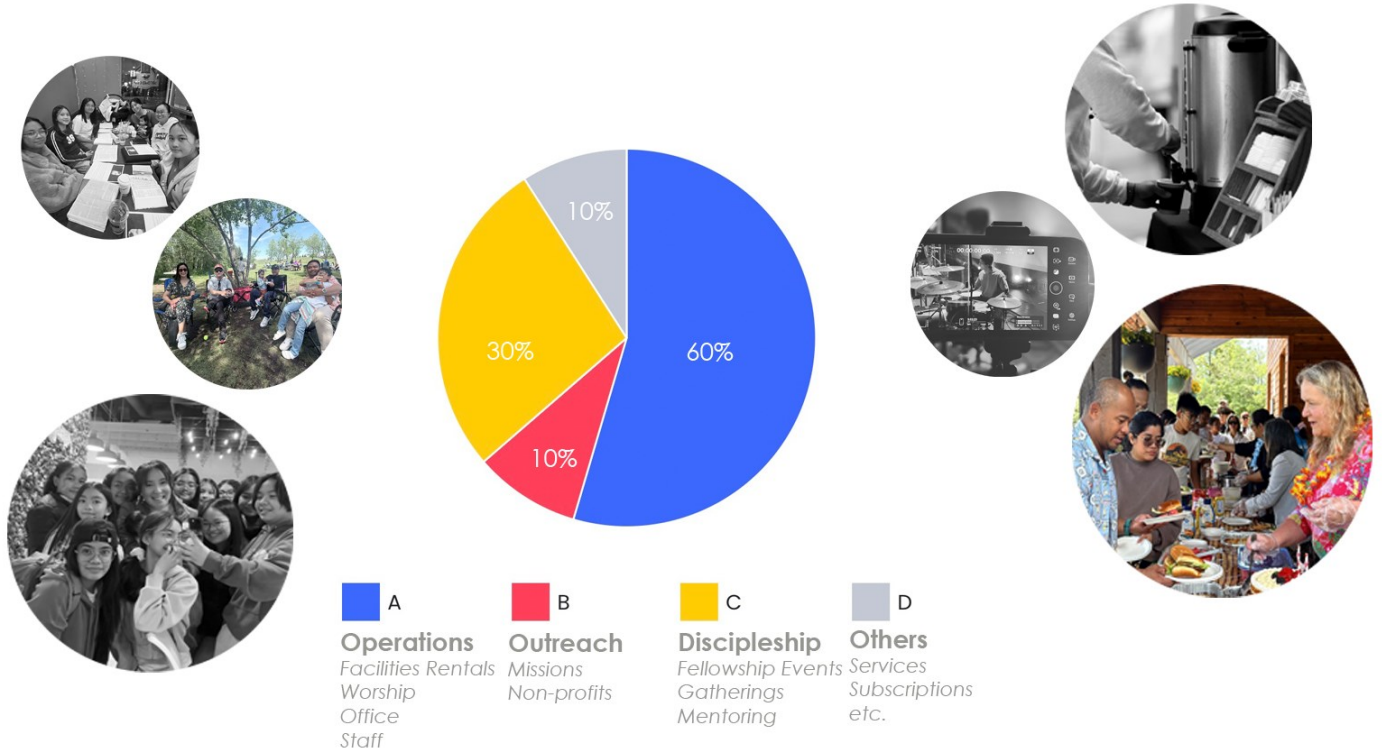
