



DISCUSSION GUIDE WEEK 4
(April 26th – May 2nd)

MISSION

This four-week vision series for 2026-2028 is titled **KINGDOM CULTURE**. Each week, we will look into four purposes entrusted to the church: to keep preaching Christ (Gospel), keep building community (Fellowship), keep living out Christ's love (Compassion), and keep reaching people far from God (Mission)!

WHAT IS MISSION?

Derived from the Latin *missio*, meaning a "sending" or "being sent," the mission of every believer and local church is to make the message of Jesus Christ known to all people, especially in unreached areas.

This mission is God's (*Missio Dei*), and through our Lord Jesus, He saved us and is calling us to join Him in His mission to redeem humanity one life at a time and to renew creation, hence it is called the Great Commission, in the sense that we are on mission with Him. Involvement in the Mission can be as simple as telling your neighbor about Jesus, inviting them to know Him. It can involve dedicating your whole life to serving God in church leadership, church planting or leaving your home culture into another to share the Gospel.

In a sense, our church exists for the not-yet-here!

 Read **Matthew 28:18-20; John 17:20-21**

1. What is your biggest takeaway from the sermon?
2. What does it mean that Jesus has "*all authority in heaven and on earth*," and how should this affect your daily life?
3. How does understanding Jesus' authority change your approach to sharing the gospel?
4. Pastor said, "Jesus wants mobilized disciples not a crowd of converts." What is the difference between making disciples and simply making converts?
5. What instruction does Jesus give to his disciples regarding the making new disciples? Why is baptism important, and what does it symbolize in the context of discipleship? What are the "all things" that Jesus commanded that we are responsible for teaching new believers?
6. How does the promise of Jesus' presence ("I am with you always") provide comfort and motivation?
7. "Mosaic Church exists for the not-yet-here." In John 17:20-21, Jesus prays for those who have yet to believe our message. If Jesus has already prayed for you, what is currently holding you back from obeying the command to "go"?
8. Pastor Jon said, "Your mission field is where God has placed you." How do you turn the place where you are into a mission field God has for you?
9. Who is in your current sphere of influence that you can begin to disciple, and how will you start?

WORK. Apply God's Word:

1. Pastor Jon said, "Our goal for every person at Mosaic to be mobilized for mission by embracing a missional lifestyle." What does missional lifestyle mean? Read 1 Corinthians 9:19-23.
2. An exciting part of Mosaic's future is seeing more people come to Jesus, get baptized and discipled here in our city because His disciples at Mosaic are obedient in mission. But Pastor also shared a vision for a new church plant in North Battleford. What are some ways we can support that new extension of Mosaic?
3. Do you view the Great Commission as a joyful privilege or a burdensome command? How can you grow in seeing it as a joy?
4. How can your small group work better together to make an impact on our community or the world?
